Biblical Truth

Supporting Truths

1. Jesus isn't just a person; He is God incarnate. (vv.18-20)

Supporting Truths

2. Jesus doesn't just proclaim the good news; He is the good news. (vv.21-22)

3. Jesus didn't just predict these glorious events; He planned them. (vv.21-22)
